RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE

The students must conduct themselves in a manner that will uphold and enhance the prestige and reputation of the college both within and outside the campus. Courtesy is an essential quality of professionals. It is therefore imperative that the students possess a pleasant disposition and should be courteous to staff, guests and friends.

1. The medium of instruction, examination and communication is English. Students must speak English in the campus.
2. Students are required to conform to the grooming standards of the college in the matter of uniforms and personal hygiene. The uniform should be worn on all working days.
3. Lack of attention and indifference towards studies, lack of courtesy towards staff members or outsiders will be viewed seriously.
4. The students should wear their identity tags on all days.
5. The conduct of the student in the classroom and on the premises must be satisfactory. Indulgence in any act of violence is a serious offence that warrants immediate expulsion from the institution along with forfeiture of fees.
6. Habitual negligence in work, dishonesty, obscenity in word or act, insubordination or such other acts of misconduct will involve serious disciplinary action.
7. In compliance with the order of the Honourable Supreme Court of India and as per the instructions from the university, incidents of ragging will be seriously dealt with.
8. Students should take care of the property of the college and help to keep the campus clean.
9. Any property damaged due to the negligence of the students will be repaired/replaced at the expense of the students.
10. Unruly behaviour, loud and aggressive talk, shouting or howling will not be allowed in the campus.
11. All fees and dues must be remitted to the office on or before the stipulated dates, failing which, a fine will be levied and the student may not be permitted to attend class or appear for examinations. Fees once paid are not refundable.
12. Smoking is strictly prohibited.
13. No society/ club/ association will be formed in the college without the Principal's permission.

14. Outsiders are not to be invited to address the students of the college without prior permission from the college authorities.
15. The students shall not take part in politics or political campaigning within the campus.
16. A suggestion box is placed in the college lobby. All suggestions and comments may be addressed to the Principal.
17. The Principal reserves the right to suspend/ dismiss any student if it is felt that the continuance of the student in the college is detrimental to the proper functioning/ interest of the college.
18. Students who wish to avail themselves of bus and railway concessions should contact the office.
19. Use of mobile phones, cameras and personal gadgets of any kind are not permitted in the campus as per Government Order R.T No 346/05 H.E dated 1-3-05. If students are found with such gadgets they will be fined Rs.1000/- and the gadgets will not be returned until the course is completed. However the student shall be allowed to deposit the gadgets at the reception for special purpose, with the permission of the Principal.
20. The vehicles of students will be permitted in the campus only with the vehicle pass issued by the college (Two- wheelers). Vehicle passes will be issued to students who present a request duly signed by the parents.
21. The student should wear a helmet. Bringing a different vehicle will require a fresh pass.
22. Ragging is a very serious criminal offence Under Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998 and is punishable with 2 years imprisonment along with penalty of Rs. 10,000/-. Students committing the offence will be expelled from the institution and they shall not be given admission to any other educational institution for a period of 3 years from the date of expulsion (Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998)
23. Students should wear their photo pasted identity cards while on campus. Students who fail to do so will lose their attendance for the day
24. Performing cinematic dances and fashion shows within Educational Institutions are also prohibited by the Government vide G.O No. 346/05 H.E dated 1-3-05
25. It is not permitted to stick bills, posters or scribble on any part of

the building, compound wall, any wall, black boards or furniture.

Damage to college property will warrant strong disciplinary action.

26. The campus is a smoke free zone. Smoking or selling cigarettes and other tobacco products and drugs in an area within a radius of 100 yards of Educational Institution is prohibited vide GO No. 822./05/H dt. 12-05-2005

27. It is forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones which are specifically permitted by the Principal. No political activity shall be permitted in the campus. Strong disciplinary action will be taken against those who break these rules.

The Principal will take decision for matters not included in these regulations and the decisions will be final. Non-compliance with the college rules is a serious offence and will seriously be dealt with.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

1. Students must be punctual for assembly, theory and practical classes, submission of journals, assignments and projects.
2. Students are required to obtain 75% attendance of the total working days, failing which he/she will not be permitted to appear for the qualifying examinations.
3. If a student is late for an hour, he/she will be marked absent for that hour. If a student is late for the Morning Prayer which begins at 9.20 am he/she will be marked absent for the first hour.

LEAVE AND ABSENTEEISM

1. Absence without leave is considered as a breach of discipline and any leave taken without proper sanction will be liable for disciplinary action.
2. Absence must be informed to the department concerned (through college landline) between 9.30 AM and 10.30 AM.
3. Prior permission for leave must be obtained in writing duly authorized by the parent/local guardian. Leave forms should be obtained from the store in advance.
4. Submission of leave application does not ensure granting of leave.
5. Leave can be taken only if the authority concerned has sanctioned it. Leave will be granted depending on the merit of the case.
6. Absence due to ill-health should be intimated to the office at the earliest and a medical certificate should be produced at the time of return.

7. Students will not be permitted to leave the college premises during working hours without written permission from the Principal. This will be granted only in cases of emergency or illness

ഒരു വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയോട് ക്രമ വിരുദ്ധമായ പെരുമാറ്റം മൂലം വിദ്യാർത്ഥിക്ക് ശാരീരികമോ മാനസികമോ ആയ പീഡനം ഉണ്ടാകുന്നതോ, ഉണ്ടാകാൻ സാദ്ധ്യതയുള്ളതോ അല്ലെങ്കിൽ ഭയാശങ്കയോ, ഭയപ്പാടോ, അപമാനമോ, ബുദ്ധിമുട്ടോ ഉണ്ടാകുന്നതോ ആയ ഏതെങ്കിലും പ്രവർത്തി ചെയ്യൽ എന്നർത്ഥമാക്കുതും അതിൽ:

2. ഒരു വിദ്യാർത്ഥി സാധാരണ ഗതിയിൽ സ്വമനസ്സാലെ ചെയ്യാൻ ഒടുവെപ്പാത്ത ഏതെങ്കിലും പ്രവർത്തി ചെയ്യുന്നതിനോ നിർവ്വഹിക്കുന്നതിനോ ആവശ്യപ്പെടുന്നതോ ഉൾപ്പെടുന്നതാകുന്നു.

1. Fees will be collected in 2 installments every year.
2. The semester fee shall be paid at bank only through online.
3. Students must pay semester fees on or before the notified date through online. After the due dates fees will be accepted (for a period of 15 days) along with a fine of Rs. 100/- which will multiply on a weekly basis.

 - b. Payment of fee dues with fine.
6. Students who wish to discontinue the course, after the official commencement of the course are liable to pay the whole fees due to the college for the respective course of study in lump sum before applying for the TC.
7. Hostel fee and Bus Fee should be paid at the beginning of every academic year.

RESTRUCTURED CURRICULUM - UNIVERSITY OF KERALA

The college is affiliated to the University of Kerala. Students are admitted to the First Degree Programme follow Choice Based Credit and Semester (CBCS) system which includes six courses viz, Language Courses, Foundation Course, Core Course, Complementary Course Vocational Course, Elective Course and Project/ Dissertation. The normal duration of the Degree Programme is three years consisting of six semesters. Each semester includes five months inclusive of the days of the examinations with atleast 90 working days and 450 instructional hours. For all courses (Theory and Practical), Grades are given on a 7-point scale on the total percentage of marks. The grading Criteria is given below:

A minimum of 40% marks (E Grade) is required for passing a course with separate minimum of 40% marks (E Grade) for Continuous Evaluation and End Semester Evaluation.

EXAMINATIONS AND INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

For all programmes offered by the college, two semester tests/model exam will be conducted and their average will be considered for CE. All papers except Project/ Dissertation will have internal exams. Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each paper. Continuous Evaluation marks shall be consolidated by adding the marks of attendance, assignments/ seminars and test paper.
